Peju Wahab is a rising star in the Nollywood film industry, known for her powerful performances and unique blend of emotional depth and authenticity.



#### SUPPORTING ACTRESS




His legacy extends beyond his performances, as he remains an influential educator and mentor, committed to nurturing the next generation of Nigerian actors.
